Physical Restraint of Violent Students is Never a Good Idea

(Condensed from an article by Joe Pece in @OECTA; Oct 2017 issue; page 17)

- -Nothing in the Ed Act permits a teacher to use physical restraint.
- -Teacher obligation is to exercise reasonable care in protecting all students; even those perpetuating violence.
- -If physical contact is made, an investigation is usually initiated putting the teacher at risk of discipline.
- -Teachers with non-violent crisis intervention or restraint training certification are held to a higher standard.
- -A trained teacher may be subject to more serious consequences than the one who is not trained.
- -Bds with non-violent crisis intervention programs might not cover costs of liabilities assigned to a teacher restraining a student.
- -WSIB benefits (for teachers seriously injured performing such duties) are often difficult to recover.
- -Bds actively oppose compensation for injured teachers.
- -A teacher put in a situation of ongoing risk of harm for a continuous application of restraint, should contact OECTA locally or provincially about a possible health and safety remedy.

Ontario Federation of Labour Convention Highlights

- -The OFL financial status has moved from tenuous to stable in the last 2 years.
- -President Chris Buckley, Exec V.P. Ahmad Gaied, and Secty-Treasurer Patty Coates remain for 2 years.

5 Paid days Leave for Domestic Violence Victims

The ON govt has announced that victims of domestic violence will be allowed 5 paid days off work and a further 5 unpaid days as part of a revamp of labour legislation.

New Call Centre System

Effective Jan 1 2018 the plan will use ON fee guides only, regardless of the member's province of residence.

Thinking about buying winter tires? Here's what you need to know.

Winter tires improve handling and overall traction in snowy, icy and slushy conditions and reduce the likelihood of collisions. They can even reduce braking distances by up to 25%! Their wider tread and softer rubber are designed to eject snow and ice and prevent skidding on the frozen roads.

When shopping for winter tires, here are a few things to remember:

- Check for a logo of a peaked mountain with a snowflake. This is how you differentiate winter tires from regular all-season tires.
- Consider the severity of weather in your area. If you get a lot of snow and ice, be sure to get tires that can handle those conditions.
- Purchase and install your winter tires in sets of four. Many retailers offer discounts for buying a set of four tires.
- Change your tires as soon as your need to. You can check how worn your tires are from the tread-wear indicators.
- Do not mix tires of different sizes or treads. This can create unsafe driving conditions.
- Check the air pressure on your tires frequently. Not only does this help with the overall safety of your vehicle, it also optimizes fuel efficiency!

It's also important to switch out your winter tires when the seasons change. Winter tires are not well suited to warmer weather conditions and they will wear much quicker. If you are diligent about changing your tires, they can last up to five years.
